

#1. Immersive Environmental Education for 3,338 students grades 4th-12th

Students in our Ventura River Action Network, Tales of Exploration, and ATCI programs, and from Channel Is. HS Marine Science Academy, learned ocean, climate, energy and environmental sciences through in-class & outdoor hands-on activities and project-based learning.

#2. Involved 1,385 students in Scientific Research and Habitat Restoration

During 30 field experiences at Ventura River, Estuary, State Beaches, Channel Islands and Ormond Beach that included freshwater quality & macroinvertebrates monitoring, bird ID and census, sandy beach and rocky intertidal, beach profiles, microplastics, and other parameters

#3. Launched a new Outdoor Recreation & Environmental Education Program

Titled 'From the Ave. to the Channel Islands' (ATCI) for 800+ students per year and their communities at the Avenue in Ventura through an Outdoor Equity Grant. Youth participate in camping at Santa Cruz Island, kayaking, sailing, surfing, environmental monitoring, leadership & career pathways.

#4. First World Oceans Day Celebration Through the lens of Youth in City of Oxnard

Thanks to the National Geographic Society, Channel Is. Harbor Foundation, and Port of Hueneme, the event celebrated students' Storytelling for Impact projects as part of our "Tales of Exploration" program. Teams submitted 65 digital stories in photography, video, audio, and infographics. The top 12 stories were awarded \$3,150 in prizes.



#5. Trained 208
Educators during 13
Professional
Development Sessions

Through in-person, webinars and in the field sessions, we provided formal and informal educators from 4 counties with resources such as curricula, training of storytelling for impact, and practices on environmental data collection. Disbursed \$23,500 in teacher stipends to help bring the ocean to their classroom and after-school programs.



#6. Engaged 600 residents in Clean & Renewable Energy

Informed 120 households from disadvantaged communities of La Colonia and El Rio in the City of Oxnard, and from the Avenue in Ventura, about the benefits of clean and renewable energy. Enrolled half of the households with Clean Power Alliance to receive a 20% discount on their electric bill.



#7. Youth Outdoor Leadership Training for a Select Group of Youths

Led 9 students from De Anza Middle School to attend CA State Parks Outdoor Youth Leadership (OYC) training at San Luis Reservoir. Students learned outdoor camping, leadership, and communication skills and will job shadow environmental professionals.

#8. 500+ Youth Created Projects to Reduce the Carbon Footprint of Their Schools

Students from Ventura Unified School
District addressed climate change and the
need to remove the Matilija dam by
innovating projects to increase energy
efficiency, reduce waste, or conserve water
on their school campuses or by creating an
awareness campaign. At the Annual
EECCOA Challenge, the top 12 of 78 teams
were awarded \$3800 in cash prizes and a
trip to visit Channel Islands National Park.

#9. Environmental Education & Litter Abatement Program for the City of Oxnard

From Dec. 2022 to Dec. 2024, twelve schools and 450-750 youths in grades 4th-12th will be given the education and outreach tools to inspire their schools' neighboring communities to decrease litter, create outdoor classrooms, and take part in caretaking and park beautification.
